TIPS: Know exactly where your property line is located. If you are uncertain about the location of the line, check into it or work out an agreement on the fence location with your neighbor. Check any local ordinances applying to fences before beginning construction. Call the City of Rancho Santa Margarita Building Department (949) 635-1800 x6101 to be sure you abide by city codes.	

Try to keep the bottom rail of any fence at least 2" above the ground. This helps eliminate the problem of decay and makes

it easier to trim grass around the base of the fence.
